CEED LOOKING FOR FAMILY CHILD CARE PARTICIPANTS

The Center for Early Education and Development (CEED) at the University of Minnesota is looking for family child care providers to participate in a project to help train professionals in using an observational tool called the Family Child Care Environment Rating Scale (FCCERS).

Participation would include one or two trainees and a veteran user of the FCCERS coming to your family child care to observe for three hours on one morning. These observers would look at materials, such as toys, books, and equipment; watch routines like hand washing; and follow along with the children as the day goes along.

Participation does not require anything from the family child care provider except to go through a typical day. We are happy to be able to offer a \$25 Target gift card to the provider for allowing us to come in.

Have you heard about Parent Aware but don't feel ready? Then this is the perfect program for you; it's called the Parent Aware Getting Ready Project. Thanks to funding from the United Way, it's free and includes help with family partnerships, teaching materials and strategies, tracking learning, professional development, environment, and child safety. These are all the areas that are rated by the Parent Aware rating scale.

To join this project your must be:

1. A non-profit child care center or a licensed family child care provider with typical enrollment of at least 50% low income children
2. Be located in one of the Parent Aware Pilot Areas of St Paul, Minneapolis, or the Wayzata school district

You will receive:

1. Free Training in any area you need to improve for Parent Aware
2. Creative Curriculum, plus training and mentoring
3. Experienced people to help you improve your child care to prepare for the Environment Rating Scale
